Forgotten Love

(John 11:1-6 NLT) "A man named Lazarus was sick. He lived in Bethany with his sisters, Mary and Martha. This is the Mary who later poured the expensive perfume on the Lord's feet and wiped them with her hair. Her brother, Lazarus, was sick. So the two sisters sent a message to Jesus telling him, 'Lord, your dear friend is very sick. 'But when Jesus heard about it he said, 'Lazarus's sickness will not end in death. No, it happened for the glory of God so that the Son of God will receive glory from this.' So although Jesus loved Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, he stayed where he was for the next two days."

(John 11:7-8 NLT) "Finally, he said to his disciples, 'Let's go back to Judea.' But his disciples objected. 'Rabbi,' they said, 'only a few days ago the people in Judea were trying to stone you. Are you going there again?'"

(John 11:14 NLT) "So he told them plainly, 'Lazarus is dead. And for your sakes, I'm glad I wasn't there, for now you will really believe."

✓ **Critical Question:** How often do you _____?

(John 11:17-27 NLT) "When Jesus arrived at Bethany, he was told Lazarus had already been in his grave for four days. Bethany was only a few miles down the road from Jerusalem, and many of the people had come to console Martha and Mary in their loss. When Martha got word that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him. But Mary stayed in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'Lord, if only you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that God will give you whatever you ask. Jesus told her, 'Your brother will rise again.' 'Yes,' Martha said, 'he will rise when everyone else rises, at the last day.' Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Anyone who believes in me will live, even after dying. Everyone who lives in me and believes in me will never ever die. Do you believe this, Martha?' 'Yes, Lord,' she told him. 'I have always

believed you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who has come into the world from God."

✓ **Critical Question:** How often do you DOUBT?

1. Leave the MOURNERS who keep you tied to hurt.

(John 11:38-40 NLT) "Jesus was still angry as he arrived at the tomb, a cave with a stone rolled across its entrance. 'Roll the stone aside,' Jesus told them. But Martha, the dead man's sister, protested, 'Lord, he has been dead for four days. The smell will be terrible.' Jesus responded, 'Didn't I tell you would see God's glory if you believe?'"

2. Remove the BARRIERS of hurt to make way for the DISPLAY of the GLORY of God.

(John 11:43-44 NLT) "The Jesus shouted, 'Lazarus, come out!' And the dead man came out, his hands and feet bound in gravesclothes, his face wrapped in a headcloth. Jesus told them, 'Unwrap him and let him go!'"

3. OPENING your life to OTHERS is the key to experiencing FREEDOM from the past.

(John 11:45 NLT) "Many of the people ... believed in Jesus when they saw this happen."

(Galatians 5:1 NIV) "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."
